Before immigrating to the United States, CBPO Coburn was a member of the 1972 Belize National Basketball Team, which he credits in helping to build his character and self confidence. He says he took the life changing opportunities given to him and knew he had to make a difference in the lives of the youth in Belize.

This positive attitude led Evondale and Juanita to create The COBY Foundation in 2004. The non-profit organization assists economically disadvantaged Belizean youth obtain skills and discipline through teaching, coaching and mentoring. Retired from the U.S. Army and currently working with CBP in Savannah, CBPO Coburn said that The COBY Foundation is not based on hand outs, but focuses on building character and confidence in the youth community.

The COBY Foundation depends on support from the local business community and volunteers willing to give their time and support fundraisers, scholarships and sporting events. Children attend lectures and motivational classes provided by the community and have direct contact with mentors who work to build positive relationships with the children.

Each year, CBPO Coburn and his wife travel to Belize to host a large basketball tournament. The kids of The COBY Foundation participate in athletics with some well known Belizean athletes and are provided with school supplies and clothes.

Savannah Port Director John Porter proudly shares his sentiments stating, "Whether it's a lifetime of commitment to his country by serving in the military and with CBP or giving back to those in need in the community in which he grew up, Evondale's actions speak volumes about his character."
